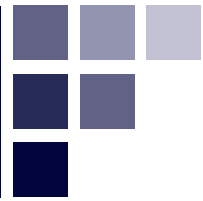


WHAT DO I NEED FOR A PHOTO SHOOT?



WHAT DO I BRING?

- A camera & case
- The appropriate lens
- Microfiber cloth (in case)
- CF or SD card(s)
- A charged battery (or 2)
- An event report sheet
- Photo exposure guide(s)
- Paper & pen
- Photographer's pass

WHAT MAKES A GREAT PHOTO?

- Photo is clean & in focus
- Good action, better reaction
- Faces, not products
- Solid composition
- Variety (not all the same person/people)

BEFORE:

1. Once you've been given an assignment, gather your supplies.
2. Format your SD/CF card to remove unwanted images.
3. Check all equipment before leaving the classroom, especially batteries.
4. Be sure transportation (if necessary) is arranged.

DURING:

1. Take pictures! Lots of them; 100 per 30 minutes.
2. Turn around. **Shoot in 360°**. Get photos of the players and crowd, action and reaction.
3. When not taking pictures, take notes. Interview.

AFTER:

1. Upload images from CF/SD to external hard drive and follow naming guidelines.
2. Check in all equipment with adviser/editor. Report any issues. File event reports.
3. Rate and review photos. Select your **favorite** photos—on average, 20 favorites for every 100 photos taken.
4. Upload favorites (not to exceed 75 for any one event) for use in design program.
